## A Response from the Minister of Labour to the allegations levelled at her in the Trinidad Express Newspaper of Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> December, 2019.

As Minister of Labour and Small Enterprise Development, I wish to address a series of misleading impressions which could be left in the minds of the population arising out of an online article written by Carolyn Kissoon in the Trinidad Express Newspapers dated December 11<sup>th</sup> 2019 and headlined "Imbert's bhagi and pumpkin statement, and Jennifer's laughter"

The article was reporting on the debate on the Proceeds of Crime and Central Bank Bill which took place in the Parliament on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> December, 2019.

I wish to make it abundantly clear that, contrary to what has been ascribed to me in the article, I never mentioned anything about "cutting grass".
