Good afternoon Ladies and Gentlemen, brothers and sisters. How is everyone this afternoon? Where are our fathers this afternoon? Happy Fathers' Day to you all. I hope you had a wonderful day thus far and I know you will have a delightful evening as you share your time with us at this Award Ceremony.

Archdeacon Primus, thank you for that uplifting prayer... I start everything with prayer, when we put the Good Lord before us, we know He will carry us through anything and everything. I know you will agree with me.

Mr. Eddie Cumberbatch, renowned Tenor, I thank you for that poreraising piece and how fortuitous that I am going to speak about achieving excellence after that excellent performance. Ladies and gentlemen, again another round of applause for Mr. Cumberbatch.

I feel very special this afternoon for having been invited to bring remarks at this very intimate event as we recognize excellence. What is excellence? Why do we work so hard towards this end? Why do we strive for excellence? We strive for excellence because it means we

She has an excellent relationship with her choir members, who describe her as having a beautiful voice and wonderful disposition. And I want to point out her astute management in this regard for acknowledging the importance of recognizing hard work, commitment and drive in hosting this Award Ceremony. This is how you build morale and continue the journey forward as you continue to forge your success.

To the members of the Holy Trinity Cathedral Folk Choir, continue to strive for great things as you chart your way forward. I want to congratulate each of you for your amazing contribution to this Choir that is not only interested in building but in giving back. From its first year, this Choir committed to visiting the Mt. Hope Hospital at Christmas time to bring cheer and inject the Spirit of Christmas to those

not as fortunate to be able to spend this Season with family. Six years ago, the Richmond Street Boys' School Choir joined in on this noble initiative. I share this with you because I want you to appreciate how special this choir is and how your work is testament to the greatness you strive for.

Today, is Labour Day. Today we observe the seventy-ninth anniversary of the birth of the Labour Movement in Trinidad and Tobago... <u>but</u> in 1937 when Tubal Uriah "Buzz" Butler led the revolution that many say gave birth to the labour landscape as we know it in Trinidad and Tobago little did he know that that was only the beginning... and he was charting a roadmap that many, including myself, journey on and we continue to recognize the struggle for decent work for all in Trinidad and Tobago.
